PRINCIPAL MESSAGE

COVID Impact

As most of us are aware, many Queensland schools are feeling the impact of COVID with the ebbs and flows of both staff and student COVID-related absenteeism. As per Queensland Health protocols, any person who tests positive to COVID must isolate for 7 days. On occasion that has, and will include classroom teachers. Whilst every effort is made to put on the same replacement teacher for the week, at times this can prove difficult with all schools in the Mackay area feeling the impact of COVID on staffing. The following proactive actions are ones we have, and will continue to take to ensure continuity of learning for all students:

- Classroom teacher provides extensive planning which outlines curriculum delivery expectations as well as information on individual student needs, to replacement teacher.
- Year level/block teaching partner to provide additional support to replacement teacher when required.
- Consistency in Teacher-Aide support to remain where possible.
- For students who have missed key assessment due to COVID-related absence, classroom teacher will support student through this assessment at a later date.

- Mr De Boni, Mrs Dal'Bo and Mrs Porter to support replacement teachers in supporting all students in the class, via regular walkthroughs and check-ins.
- Continually remind students around COVID-safe practices (washing hands, etc), and immediately call parents to collect child/ren who are displaying COVID symptoms (e.g. runny nose).

At Glenella SS we are very fortunate to have a number of regular replacement teachers we can call upon that know our kids well, and also have a great understanding of the expectations and procedures unique to our school.

ANZAC Commemorations

At the conclusion of our ANZAC Parade in Week 1 I stated, 'I am the proudest Principal right now'. This isn't a statement I use lightly but was completely warranted with the exemplary conduct displayed by all students. Students could have been forgiven if they were a little less focussed than usual, being that is was the last session of the week, rainy and windy outside and only an hour before the long weekend kicked in. These factors did not influence our kids' behaviour which further contributed to a great ceremony in honour of all those who gave so much for this country. Special mention to our school leaders who did a brilliant job in running this parade.

Similarly, I was very proud to see all the students, staff and parents who braved the wet and windy conditions to march in the annual Mackay ANZAC March. As I've said in previous correspondence I sadly could not make this important morning (due to COVID) but would like to thank all those who proudly represented our school.



A-E Meetings

Over the next two weeks I will be conducting A-E meetings with all classroom teachers. The purpose of these meetings is to have a professional discussion about how all students are progressing in both English and Maths, as well as develop agreed takeaway actions to improve overall student outcomes. This action is part of one of our key school priorities – 'Knowing our Kids, Planning for Success.'

A decision has been made to combine both the Junior and Senior Athletics Carnivals on Tuesday 14th June. This will contribute to the whole school atmosphere of the carnival, as well as allow parents of students from both junior and senior sectors to attend on the same day. NAPLAN Online 2022

All the best to our Year 3 and 5 students who will carry out NAPLAN Online next week! This is the first time Glenella has completed the NAPLAN test in the online format. Students carried out practice tests last term and all observations indicate that students were highly engaged with the online format.

Behaviour Focus

Each week we will have a behaviour focus that will be presented on Parade, taught in class and positively reinforced by staff throughout the week. We will focus on the following behaviour expectations for Weeks 3 and 4:

Week 3: 'I stop immediately when the bell goes.'

This is a simple expectation but a very important one. As soon as the bell goes students must carry out any actions they need to before lining up with this class (e.g. toilet, drink, putting sport equipment away). Late students are late for learning.

Week 4: 'I am a strong Glenella mate and look out for others'

This is a great expectation for students to enact as it means they are standing up for what is right, rather than what may be 'cool,' or what the majority of the crowd are doing at the time. If someone says or does something that makes someone else feel unsafe, a strong Glenella mate will stand up for that student and let them know that this is not the 'Glenella way.'
