Coping with stress, anxiety or distress

When many things feel uncertain or out of our control, one of the most effective ways we can manage stress and anxiety is to **focus on the actions that are in our control.** Here are some ways you can take intentional steps to look after your physical and emotional wellbeing during this challenging time:

Acknowledge your feelings

Whatever you are feeling right now, know that it's okay to feel that way. Allow yourself time to notice and express what you're feeling. This could be through journaling, talking with others, or channeling your emotions into something creative (e.g., drawing, painting, poetry, music).

Maintain your day-to-day activities and a routine as much as possible

Having a healthy routine can have a positive impact on your thoughts and feelings. Go back to basics: eating healthy meals, physical exercise (e.g., walking, stretching, running, cycling), and doing things you enjoy.

Stay connected

Receiving support and care from others has a powerful effect on helping us cope with challenges. Spending time with supportive family and friends can bring a sense of comfort and stability. Talking through our concerns, thoughts, and feelings with others can also help us find helpful ways of thinking about or dealing with a stressful situation.

PREP VISION SCREENING

Good vision is important for a child's educational, physical and social development. Vision screening checks for common eye conditions that may impact your child's ability to see and therefore impact their learning and development.

A Registered Nurse will be visiting the school **on Wednesday 28th July** to conduct vision screening for Prep students. If you wish to have your prep child participate in this free vision screening program, please complete a consent form which will be sent home today by 23rd June 2021. Parents do not need to be present for screening, however if you would like to be, please contact the school to arrange this.

Participation in vision screening is not compulsory. If you do not wish for your child to participate in screening, please complete the consent form and indicate that you wish to decline screening.
